Daily Maintenance using Neutral Based Cleaner

1. Sweep or dry mop the entire area to remove all loose dirt, dust, and other debris.
2. Mop the floor with a solution of lukewarm water and 3-6 ounces of neutral based cleaner.
3. Rinse the floor thoroughly with lukewarm water and remove the excess water using a wet-vac.
4. Allow the floor to dry completely before use.

Deep Cleaning using a Neutral Based Cleaner + Disinfectant

1. Sweep or dry mop the entire area to remove all loose dirt, dust, and other debris.
2. Combine a solution of 4-6 ozs of disinfectant and neutral based cleaner to a gallon of warm water.
3. Spray applications of disinfectant may also be used.
4. Apply the solution using soft cloth, mop, scrubber, or spray application.
5. After 10 minutes of treatment, rinse the floor thoroughly with lukewarm water and allow the floor to air dry before its next use.

Please note that in some situations, more disinfectant to create a stronger solution may be used to better clean areas in question.

REMEMBER...

- Dust, dirt and spills should be removed promptly to avoid permanent damage.
- Stubborn scuff marks can be removed with a stronger solution of neutral based cleaner and water.
- Do not apply any type of floor sealer, floor finish, or floor wax.
- Do not sweep or mop the floor with oil treated mops or brooms.
- Do not scrub the floor with hard polyester or nylon pads, steel wool, wire brushes, or abrasive floor cleaners.
- Avoid wearing outdoor shoes on your Marley Vinyl floor. Outdoor elements can be harmful to the surface and may create unsafe surface conditions.

Suggested Basic Maintenance

1. Dry mop or dry sweep your floor daily.
2. Clean your floor weekly using a pH neutral cleaner/detergent. Do not use cleaners that are meant for home use. These may contain high acidity or high basic levels that could damage the surface, or leave an oily residue making it unsafe.
3. Remove scuff marks using a stronger solution of cleaner and lukewarm water.
4. If possible, use a clean and dirty bucket when mopping the solution onto the floor surface. This will remove any excess dirt and debris while cleaning.
5. If seam or top tape is removed, be sure to use a residue remover before applying new tape.
6. Be sure to dry the floor completely before the next use.
7. Some floor cleaners may leave a very thin, faint residue. If this is the case, sweat or water may make the surface slippery and unsafe for practice or performance.
